Culture and Media Program Worksheet for academic years: 2018-19 and 2019-20

In addition to the requirements outlined in this program worksheet, Lang has specific general requirements, including a minimum number of credits in liberal arts courses as well as college residency requirements. The minimum grade for Core courses is B. Receiving a grade lower than a B requires retaking the Core course if you want to continue with the major. A grade of $D$ in a non-Core LCST class cannot be counted toward the major (although it can still count for overall credits). A minimum GPA of 3.0 is expected for all students intending to declare in Culture and Media (slightly lower GPAs can be accepted if the student receives an A in the Introductory course connected to their area, or both Introductory courses if the student is mixing and matching between areas).
